

Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA) Disclosure of Information to a Third Party

Safety Trumps Privacy:

FIPPA Section 25: "...the head of a public body must, without delay, disclose to the public, to an affected group of people, or to an applicant, information

- a. about a risk of significant harm to the environment or to the health or safety of the public or a group of people; or,
- b. the disclosure of which is, for any other reason, clearly in the public interest."
